News You Can Use from your Swiss Consulate in Seattle



AHV: Effective immediately you can get your AHV Life and Civil Status Form (aka Lebensbescheinigung/ Certificat de Vie/Certificato di Vita) certified by us. Simply contact me to make an appointment. Be aware that AHV numbers changed a few years ago. I also recommend that everybody get a periodic AHV account update from the Swiss Compensation Office, Av. Edmond-Vaucher 18, P.O. Box 3100, 1211 Geneva 2. Switzerland, I do it about every 5 years and given the recent strength of the Swiss Franc you might be pleasantly surprised with the result!

NEW WEBSITE: A new networking site for the Swiss Abroad has been launched at www.Swiss Community.org. It lets you connect with other Swiss expats and keep current with relevant news and events. It is very cool so check it out.

PASSPORT RENEWALS: For most of us it is inconvenient to travel to San Francisco to renew our Swiss passports. You can now get your personal data collected for a biometric passport (Datenerfassung) in Switzerland or in Vancouver, B.C. However, you need to set up an appointment via the Consulate General in San Francisco at sfr.vertretung@eda.admin.ch or by calling 415-788-2272.

NEW HELPLINE: The Swiss Federal Department of Foreign Affairs (EDA) has launched a global toll-free helpline: 011-41-800-24-7-365. It is the one stop source for all your Swiss citizen needs in dealing with the Swiss Federal Government (Buergerservices). It is currently staffed during Swiss business hours and will be available 24 hours a day starting in 2012.

SWISS ELECTIONS ON OCTOBER 23: Do not forget to vote in the upcoming Swiss election. All members of parliament are getting elected: Nationalrat and Staenderat. This is where the political party landscape is determined for the next 4 years.



DIRECTIONS TO SOUTH SEATTLE COMMUNITY COLLEGE



From north or southbound I-5 or southbound Route 99

- Take West Seattle bridge exit from I-5 or Route 99.
- Take the Delridge Way S.W. exit.
- At third light, turn left onto S.W. Oregon Street.
- Take arterial to top of hill, veering right onto 21st Ave S.W.
- Stay on arterial as it winds up hill and turns into 16th Ave S.W.
- Follow 16th Ave S.W. south for ¹/₄ mile to SSCC campus.

South Seattle Community College 6000 16th Ave. S.W. Seattle, WA 98106 (206) 730-4251 (Security Office)

From south suburbs

- At Southcenter interchange of I-5 and I-405, exit to Highway 518 westbound.
- Exit to northbound Highway 509 at Burien interchange.
- Take the Cloverdale/South Park exit (do not cross First Ave S. bridge).
- Turn left at light onto S.W. Cloverdale Street and drive up the hill.
- Get in the righthand lane and veer right at light onto Olson Place S.W.
- Stay in right lane and veer right onto S.W. Roxbury.
- Turn right at 16th Ave S.W. and drive north for about 2 miles; or
- From Burien, drive north for six miles, beginning on Ambaum Blvd. S.W.
- Ambaum becomes 16th Ave S.W. at 116th St. S.W.

Michigan-Corson exit off I-5, north or southbound

- Take Michigan-Corson exit.
- Turn right onto South Michigan St.
- Follow Michigan to First Ave South bridge, taking ramp onto bridge.
- Take FIRST exit West Marginal Way/South Seattle Community College.
- Turn right on 2nd Ave S.W.
- Turn left on West Marginal Way S.W.
- Turn left on Highland Park Way
- Go up Highland Park Way to top of hill.
- Take first right turn onto S.W. Holden Street.
- Turn right onto 16th Ave S.W., follow north one mile to SSCC campus.
